What's Happening in July.....

1st Week:

Birds —

- Goldfinches gather Canada thistle down for their nesting material.

Wildflowers —

- Canada Lily and other lilies are beginning to bloom.

2nd Week:

Wildflowers —

- Queen Anne's lace, yarrow, milkweed, ox-eye daisy, butter-and-eggs, evening primrose and enchanter's nightshade should be in full bloom.
- Teasel heads are beginning to bloom along roadsides and in sunny open meadows.

3rd Week:

Mammals —

- Deer might be found snacking on Crab Apples as they become ripe this week.

Wildflowers —

- Early goldenrod, first of many goldenrods to bloom.
- Joe-Pye weed with its tall lavender blossoms are to be found in low wet places.
- The pale blue flowers of Chicory, some times called blue sailors, are abundant in open fields and along roadsides.

4th Week:

Wildflowers —

- Brilliant red cardinal flowers contrast with the gold and greens of cattails and sedges in wet meadows and woods this week.
- Queen Anne's lace is in abundance.
- The rich purple of ironweed and white boneset flowers brighten marsh edges.
- Water lilies are beginning to put in an appearance.

Reptiles —

- Frogs may be found in abundance around ponds and marshes.

Insects —

- Katydid and cicadas should be making their presence known.
- You can look for spiders and their webs in many open meadows as well as around your house and garden.

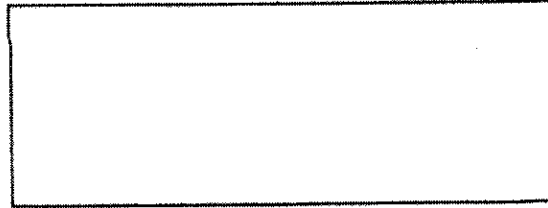

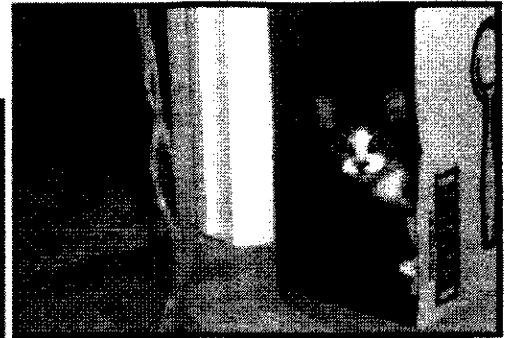
